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General Safety Warnings

General power tool safety warnings



WARNING! Read all safety warnings and instructions.

Failure to follow the warnings and instructions may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term 'power tool' in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

- This product is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Only use the product in the manner and for the functions described in these instructions.

Work area safety

- Keep the work area clean and well lit.
 Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool.
 Distractions can cause you to lose control.

Electrical safety

- Power tool plugs must match the outlet.
 Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adaptor plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators.
 There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.

- Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.

- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

- Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on. A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.
- Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times. This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.

- Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or the battery pack from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.
- Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool.
 Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- Maintain power tools. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tools operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- Keep cutting tools sharp and clean.

Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.

 Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits, etc., in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.

Training

- Read the instructions carefully. Be familiar with the controls and the correct use of the machine.
- Never allow children or people unfamiliar with these instructions to use the machine. Local regulations can restrict the age of the operator.
- Keep in mind that the operator or user is responsible for accidents or hazards occurring to other people or their property.

Preparation

- Obtain ear protection and safety glasses.
 Wear them at all times while operating the machine.
- While operating the machine, always wear substantial footwear and long trousers.

Do not operate the machine when barefoot or wearing open-toed sandals. Avoid wearing clothing that is loose fitting or that has hanging cords or ties.

- Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery that can be drawn into the air inlet. Keep long hair away from the air inlets.
- Operate the machine in a recommended position and only on a firm, level surface.
- Do not operate the machine on a paved or gravel surface where ejected material could cause injury.
- Before using, always visually inspect to see that the shredding means, shredding means bolts and other fasteners are secure, the housing is undamaged and that guards and screens are in place. Replace worn or damaged components in sets to preserve balance. Replace damaged or unreadable labels.
- Before use, check the supply and extension cord for signs of damage or aging. If the cord becomes damaged during use, disconnect the cord from the supply immediately. DO NOT TOUCH THE CORD BEFORE DISCONNECTING THE SUPPLY. Do not use the machine if the cord is damaged or worn.

Operation

- Before starting the machine, make certain that the feeding chamber is empty.
- Keep your face and body away from the feed intake opening.
- Do not allow hands or any other part of the body or clothing inside the feeding chamber, discharge chute, or near any moving part.
- Keep proper balance and footing at all times. Do not overreach. Never stand at a higher level than the base of the machine when feeding material into it.
- Always stand clear of the discharge zone when operating this machine.
- When feeding material into the machine be extremely careful that pieces of metal, rocks, bottles, cans or other foreign objects are not included.
- If the cutting mechanism strikes any foreign objects or if the machine should start making any unusual noise or vibration, immediately shut off the power source and allow the machine to stop. Disconnect the machine from the supply and take the following steps before restarting and operating the machine:
 - inspect for damage;
 - replace or repair any damaged parts;

- check for and tighten any loose parts.
- Do not allow processed material to build up in the discharge zone; this may prevent proper discharge, and can result in kickback of material through the intake opening.
- If the machine becomes clogged, shut off the power source and disconnect the machine from supply before cleaning debris.
- Never operate the machine with defective guards or shields, or without safety devices, for example debris collector in place.
- Keep the power source clean of debris and other accumulations to prevent damage to the power source or possible fire.
- Do not transport this machine while the power source is running.
- Stop the machine, and remove the plug from the socket. Make sure that all moving parts have come to a complete stop:
 - whenever you leave the machine;
 - before clearing blockages or unclogging the chute;
 - before checking, cleaning or working on the machine.
- Do not tilt the machine while the power source is running. Switch off the machine before attaching or removing the bag.

Maintenance and storage

- When the machine is stopped for servicing, inspection, or storage, or to change an accessory, shut off the power source, disconnect the machine from the supply and make sure that all moving parts come to a complete stop. Allow the machine to cool before making any inspections, adjustments, etc. Maintain the machine with care and keep it clean.
- Store the machine in a dry place out of the reach of children.
- Always allow the machine to cool before storing.
- When servicing the shredding means, be aware that, even though the power source is switched off due to the interlock feature of the guard, the shredding means can still be moved.
- Replace worn or damaged parts for safety.
 Use only genuine replacement parts and accessorises.

Intended use

 The device is designed only for blowing and suction of light DRY debris, such as leaves, grass, mulch and clippings from domestic gardens. Avoid wet materials, as it may lead to congestion in the shredder unit and lead to reduced functionality. Every other utilisation, which is not explicitly approved in these directions, can lead to damage to the device and represents a serious danger to the user.

- For safety reasons, it is essential to read the entire instruction manual before first operation and to observe all the instructions herein.
- This product is intended for private domestic use only, not for any commercial trade use. It must not be used for any other purposes.

Recommendation

- The machine should be supplied via a residual current device (RCD) with a tripping current of not more than 30mA.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons, in order to avoid a hazard.
- Supply cords shall not be lighter than
 - if rubber insulated, ordinary tough rubber sheathed flexible cord (code designation HO5 RN-F).
 - if polyvinyl chloride insulated, ordinary polyvinyl chloride sheathed flexible cord (code designation HO5 VV-F).

Emergency



WARNING!



Assembly



Assembly for blower mode


Attaching the blower tube (fig. 3 & 4)

1. Push the lower tube firmly into the upper tube until the tubes 'click' into place.



2. Push the blower tube forward until the notched areas on the blower housing lock into the slots on the tube, as shown in Fig. 4.


NOTE: Blower tube must be assembled to the motor housing before use. Never operate without tube assembled.



3. Ensure vacuum cover (A) is attached to the motor housing. If not, screw the vacuum cover as shown in Fig. 5.


NOTE: Tool will not operate in blower mode without vacuum cover in

place.




Assembly for vacuum mode


1. Attach the push-on collection bag connector to the outlet tube of the housing. Push the fitting of the collection bag directly onto the outlet until it 'clicks' into the position as shown in Fig. 6.




2. Open the vacuum cover (A) from the bottom of the motor housing by unscrewing the lock button and pulling the cover down (Fig. 7).




3. Align the lower vacuum tube to the upper vacuum tube until the tubes 'click' into place (Fig. 8).



4. Attach the vacuum tube assembly to the motor housing by locating the assembly, as indicated by the arrow, then pivot about this point until the locking/release catch is fully engaged (Fig. 9 & 10).



5. To remove the vacuum tube, unscrew the lock botton and pull straight off (Fig. 11).



Operation




WARNING! Flying debris can cause serious personal injury to the operator, bystanders or pets. Keep bystanders and pets at least 15 feet away from the area of work, and always wear suitable eye and ear protection, long pants and sturdy shoes or boots while operating the tool.

Use of extension cord



WARNING! A damaged extension cord can cause electric shock or a fire. Please inspect the extension cord periodically. The tool must not be used if the cord is damaged in any way. Replace a damaged extension cord before use.

- Use a heavy-duty extension cord suitable for outdoor use and so marked. An ordinary duty extension cord will cause loss of power and may overheat.
- Keep the extension cord behind you, away from the area of operation.
- 3. Use the extension as shown in Fig. 12.




Operation of the Blower Vac


The blower vac is fitted with a variable speed switch located on the top of the motor housing below the handle. Prior to using the blower vac, ensure you have read and understood this user manual.

Ensure you are wearing suitable clothing and also safety equipment like safety glasses, ear protection and mask if necessary. Ensure the attachments to the blower vac are correctly fitted and adjusted. Be aware of other people and animals in the area where you are to be operating the blower vac.

To turn the blower vac on

- 1. Plug the power cord into an approved electrical extension cord, and connect to the power source.
- 2. To turn the tool on, push the switch button to position 'I', see Fig. 13.
- 3. To adjust the speed, turn the speed control switch (9) from '1' to '6' (Min. to Max.), see Fig. 14.








WARNING! Be sure to hold the blower vac firmly on start up.

To turn the blower vac off

To turn the tool off, pull the switch button back to position 'O'

(Fig. 15).



IMPORTANT: After you have turned the blower vac off, remove the plug from the power supply.




WARNING! The tool runs for approximately 5 seconds after it has been switched off. Let the motor come to a complete standstill before setting the tool down.



WARNING! Ensure product is switched off and disconnected from the power supply.


Blower mode (Fig. 16)

- Attach the blower tube assembly to the motor housing.
- Connect the extension cord to the tool, then plug into a power supply.
- Hold the blower tube approximately 2 to 4 inches above the ground, turn the blower vac on and using a sweeping motion from side to side, advance slowly keeping the accumulated debris/leaves in front of you.
- Once you have blown the debris/leaves into a pile, you can convert to vacuum mode to collect the debris.



Vacuum mode (Fig. 17)

- Remove blower tube and attach the shoulder collection bag onto the tool.
- Attach the vacuum tube.
- Attach the collection bag to the motor housing.
- Connect the extension cord to the tool, then plug into a power supply.
- Position the tube slightly above the debris/leaves. Turn the blower vac on, then using a sweeping motion the debris/leaves will be sucked up the tube, mulched and deposited into the collection bag.
- As the bag fills, the power of the suction will decrease. Turn off the blower vac and unplug from the power supply.





WARNING! Always make sure the collection bag is correctly attached.

Always be aware of what is being drawn up into the blow/vacuum tube. This product is only designed for dry garden debris like leaves, twigs and garden cuttings.

To empty the collection bag

The collection bag is attached to the blower vac in two places. It is not necessary to remove the collection bag from the blower vac when the bag needs to be emptied. The rear of the bag has a full length zip. Simply open the zip and empty the contents. Be sure to close the zip prior to operating the blower vac again.



WARNING! Normal usage of the bag causes it to wear and deteriorate over time. A worn or deteriorated bag allows small objects to be thrown through the bag, possibly injuring the operator or bystanders. Check the bag frequently. If it is worn or deteriorated, replace it with a new vacuum bag.

Operating Tips

The following points may assist you in the operation of the blower vac. Always try to vacuum dry leaves, cuttings or general garden debris. Wet materials are difficult to mulch and can cause the blower vac to clog. If the leaves or other debris are damp, then use the blower vac in blow selection to pile the leaves or other debris into one area. Vacuum and mulch the leaves when dry. Avoid using the vacuum on areas where there are stones or other hard objects. These objects will damage the impellor of the blower vac. It is also advisable not to allow the blower vac to pick up soil. Soil generally contains moisture and when combined with other garden debris can clog the blower vac. The blower vac is not a garbage disposal unit. Do not attempt to mulch any material other than general garden debris. For better performance and comfort, it is recommended the collection bag is emptied when it becomes approximately half full. This reduces the weight and allows the vacuum to operate at its highest level.

Maintenance and Repair

Maintenance and Repair




WARNING! Always switch the product off and let the product cool down before performing inspection, maintenance and cleaning work!

If you need to replace the fitted plug, then follow the instructions below.

IMPORTANT: The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Blue - Neutral / Brown - Live

As the colours of the wire in the mains lead of this product may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows. The blue wire must be connected to the terminal marked 'N' or coloured black. The brown wire must be connected to the terminal marked 'L' or coloured red.





WARNING!

Never connect live or neutral wires to the earth terminal of the plug.



WARNING!

Always wear protective gloves during maintenance operations. Do not carry out maintenance when the engine is running or hot.



WARNING!

Use only manufacturer approved replacement parts, accessories and attachments. Failure to do so can cause possible injury and poor performance.

- 1. Store the tool, user manual and accessories in a secure, dry place. This way, you will always have the information ready.
- 2. Keep the tools air vents unclogged and clean at all times.
- 3. Remove dust and dirt regularly. Cleaning is best done with a rag or brush.

- 4. Never use caustic agents to clean plastic parts.
- 5. Empty the bag after each use to avoid deterioration and obstructing air flow, which will reduce the performance of the tool.
- 6. Wash the bag regularly and let it fully dry before zipping it closed.



WARNING!

Do not use cleaning agents to clean the plastic parts of the tool. A mild detergent on a damp cloth is recommended. Water must never come into contact with the tool.

Storage

- 1. Clean the blower or vacuum tubes thoroughly before storing.
- 2. Store the blower vac in a dry, well-ventilated place that is inaccessible to children. Store the tool locked up to prevent unauthorised use or damage.
